

Travel Directions

From I-95 North

Take exit 83 (Downtown New London) onto Huntington Street; Proceed straight to stop sign.

Turn right onto Jay Street to first traffic light. Turn right at traffic light onto Hempstead Street. Turn left from Hempstead Street into OIC's parking lot.



From I-95 South

Take exit 84S (Downtown New London). Proceed straight to Eugene O'Neill Drive and through downtown to Tilley Street. Turn right onto Tilley Street and drive one block to Washington Street. Turn left onto Washington, go straight to traffic light. Turn right at traffic light onto Hempstead Street. Turn left from Hempstead Street into OIC's parking lot.
